IV. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

This Comprehensive Plan was initiated by the *Owensville Town Council* to improve the ability of the Town of Owensville to adequately respond to development, growth, land use, and other issues the community may face in the future. Further discussion between the Clerk-Treasurer and the *Owensville Town Council* also helped to initiate this Comprehensive Planning Process.

Many people participated throughout the Comprehensive Planning Process including members of the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee, Town Council, Town staff, local business owners, and a variety of community representatives and residents.

A. Initial Owensville Comprehensive Plan Meeting

The first meeting was held with the Owensville Town Council to explain the components, reasons, and intended uses of a Comprehensive Plan. The preferred meeting location, times and dates for future meetings were established at this time. The group also began to discuss plans for the Community Workshop.

B. Owensville Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee Meetings

The Owensville Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee met throughout the Comprehensive Planning Process. Their first major task was to help coordinate the Community Workshop and serve as scribes for the ad hoc teams developed at this workshop. The second major task of the Steering Committee was to review the results of this Community Workshop and to create and then finalize a set of goals, objectives and strategies to serve as the foundation of the Owensville Comprehensive Plan.

The Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee also provided project assistance by giving direction to the consultant concerning the Town's desired project outcome, coordinating meetings, and providing background information about the Town of Owensville.

Additional Steering Committee meetings were held to review drafts of the Comprehensive Plan and its elements. Below is a list of all of the Steering Committee meeting dates.

C. Owensville Community Workshop

On **April 3, 2008**, a public meeting was held at the *Owensville Community Center* as an opportunity for the community to provide input into the Comprehensive Planning Process. Attendees were asked to evaluate different aspects of the community. The meeting was publicized and all members of the community were encouraged to attend and participate in the activities at the Community Workshop.

Approximately 60 members of the community attended the Community Workshop. The participants were randomly divided into 7 groups, with each group having approximately 9 people. The participants were then asked a series of community-related questions. Several Steering Committee members and community volunteers were designated as "scribes" and were placed at each table. These scribes were asked to record all of the comments and suggestions expressed by the members of their group regardless of difference in opinions held within their group or by the Steering Committee member themselves. Each group discussed community Strengths (Likes), Weaknesses (Dislikes), Opportunities, and Threats. Once a new topic was asked, the group posted their list on the wall nearest to their table.

The lists on the following pages are a synopsis of the comments that were made by the attendees. They have been sorted into different topic groups. Because it is important to recognize the list that each comment originated from, comments have been color-coded as follows: Black = Strengths, Red = Weaknesses, Blue = Opportunities and Orange = Threats. The lists also include comments that had been gathered at a similar Community Workshop held in 2005. These comments are represented by the lighter-shades with the same color-coded format described above. *(The lists are comprised of comments taken directly from the meeting sheets; they have generally not been altered; some duplication exists due to the same comment being made by multiple groups.)*

Once all of the groups had compiled their lists of Strengths (Likes), Weaknesses (Dislikes), Opportunities, and Threats, each group was asked to make a "Top 10" List of the most important issues that their group had discussed. These lists were posted on a wall and each person was given the opportunity to cast five votes directly onto the lists with different-colored dot stickers. The attendees were advised that they could vote on any of the lists, using their one "red dot" for the most important issue and then the four "green dots" for the other concerns that they considered to be the next most important.

The next page shows a table with a compilation of these "Top Ten" List items and the number of red and green votes for each item, along with a combined total of red and green dots for each item. The items on the list are ranked by a total number of points with each red dot assigned a value of three points and each green dot assigned a value of two points.
